

Creating Awareness on COVID-19 Vaccination is the Need of the Hour

PRIST NSS Cell is using social media to spread the word about the COVID-19 vaccine. Here, raising awareness in and around Thanjavur about the significance of the current situation has turned into a pressing need for testing. The first and second waves of the Corona virus pandemic caused a sharp decline in global mortality rates and presented an unparalleled challenge to the food, public health, and workplace sectors. The COVID-19 epidemic has had a terrible effect on socioeconomic instability. The COVID-19 epidemic has been affecting the food system as a whole, exposing its vulnerabilities. Trade restrictions, border closures, and restraint measures have made it more difficult for farmers to access markets, which means they can't sell their produce or buy inputs. They have also made it harder for agricultural workers to harvest crops, disrupting both the domestic and global food supply chains and making it harder for people to follow distinct, healthy diets. The COVID-19 pandemic has destroyed employment and jeopardised the livelihoods of millions of people. Millions of men and women's food security and nutrition are at risk due to the loss of jobs, illnesses, and deaths of family leaders and financial supporters. Those living in developing and economically backward nations, particularly the most marginalised groups, such as small-scale farmers and indigenous people, are most affected.



VACCINATION AWARENESS PROGRAMME

On September 6, 2021, NSS volunteers organised the National Immunisation Day Awareness Program. They also actively participated in the successful execution of the COVID-19 vaccine rollout activities, which included community engagement and mobilisation, message dissemination about the benefits of vaccination, and fostering community confidence regarding vaccine safety through a variety of media, including social media, door-to-door awareness, public announcements, wall painting, posters, and so on. 150 NSS volunteers worked to create an atmosphere that would increase vaccination acceptance across the nation and urged individuals to embrace COVID-19 acceptable behaviour. for the effective execution of this national initiative.

A program of awareness was held on March 9, 2022.Risk factors, high-risk locations, symptoms, signs, diagnosis, treatment, consequences, and above all—the preventative measures and safety precautions that should be followed were all made known. They were informed about the significance of mask use, the individuals at high risk who must wear masks, and the fact that not everyone must wear a mask. They were also informed that the best way to contain such a pandemic is to be aware of the issue, assume responsibility for educating peers and other family members about it, and contact hospitals and healthcare providers if they have any suspicions. Panicking will not help in any way. The significance of hand cleanliness was also covered. The event ran until about 3:45 pm, after which there was a Q&A period for student volunteers, instructors, and POs to clear up any misunderstandings. With great enthusiasm, the children took part in the conversation and offered questions that were addressed.




BLOOD AWARENESS RALLY WALKATHON

HEALTH AND HYGIENE AWARENESS PROGRAMME

(HEALTH CAMP FOR WOMEN)

On October 7, 2021, a health awareness program was held at our university. Prominent and well-known physicians from our community were asked to participate in this session. Dr. Malarvizhi, a well-known nutritionist in the area, was chosen to serve as the camp president. Every doctor stressed how important personal cleanliness and health are. The students were urged by the physicians to maintain hygiene and to have a healthy, well-balanced diet. In order to prevent infections like malaria, dengue, and intestinal illnesses, the majority of doctors emphasised the need for sleeping under mosquito nets at night and drinking boiling water. Students were warned not to be seduced by chopped fruit, coloured drinks, quick meals, or cold beverages. The experts also stressed the need for engaging in regular physical activity. Frequent exercise strengthens and maintains the health of the body. The guest physicians also emphasised the need for maintaining personal hygiene, including washing and cleaning one's hands. It was said that pupils should abstain from all forms of harmful products. There are twenty volunteers and fifty housekeeping staff participating in this initiative.





WOMEN AND CHILD WELFARE AND CYBER CRIME AWARENESS PROGRAMME on 14.10.2022

In collaboration with the Ministry of Women and Child Development and the District Social Welfare Office, PRIST University's NSS Cell organised a program to educate college students about the right to a high-quality life that is guaranteed to all Indian people. In order for women to live in peace and harmony within Indian society, Bharatiya Stree Shakti works to empower women and promote gender equality. The notorious "Nirbhaya" case caused a great deal of indignation and was strongly denounced both in India and elsewhere. The Indian government's Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD) looked at the effects of amended laws and policies. SCHOOL RENOVATION WORK

The elementary school Kuruvadipatti Primary School serves grades 1 through 5. The school has a pre-primary department as well. About 300 students are enrolled in total. As of right now, there are eight teachers. The distance between Vallam town and the school in Thanjavur is around 5 km.

Evaluation of the needs for infrastructure:

Two classrooms were lacking for the primary (elementary) courses of grades 1 through 5, as there were only three usable classrooms for them. To make the three run-down classrooms in the block more conducive to learning, some work needed to be done. The iron and asbestos roof had holes in it, which clearly let water seep through during the rainy season. The walls were not plastered and appeared to have cracks in them. There was no covering on the windows. There were large potholes and/or dust on the floor. Additionally, there weren't many student desks. Therefore, it was necessary to build two new classrooms and rehabilitate the three old, outdated classrooms in the block. The numerous tasks were completed by our PRIST NSS Cell.
